

Highly reputated wine competition will take place in Luxemburg from May 21 – 23 this year

Concours Mondial de Bruxelles (CMB), one of the most highly reputated wine competitions in the world, will take place in Luxemburg this year from May 21 – 23. Ten years after the competition last time was hosted there, it will return to the Grand Duchy. The initial plan to organize CMB 2021 in Ningxia / China was postponed to 2022 due to the Corona virus pandemy. Deadline for inscriptions now is April 20.

Baudouin Havaux, President of Concours Mondial de Bruxelles, is longing for the return to the neighbor country Luxemburg: "A great thank you for disposal of the perfectly suited LuxExpo Centre for our tastings and the programme for our tasters with visits through the five wine regions along Mosel valley." In a year without any important international wine shows it will be essential for all producers to lift up visibility of their wines all around the world. Especially the uprising wineries in Eastern Europe, which are coming more and more into

the international focus with good qualities, should point on that. Havaux: "CMB helps them to promote their wines and conquer new markets."

During the tastings as well as along the wine trips through Luxemburg the same strict health safety concept proven at the successful edition of CMB 2020 in Brno / Czech Republic will be applied. Because of the pandemic once again only tasters from European countries will be invited.

Concours Mondial de Bruxelles usually receives more than 9,000 wine samples from all around the world. This makes CMB one of the biggest and most important wine competitions globally.
